CANADIAN JEW BELIEVING
INGW PALESTINE

According to Treasurer's report for
period, June, 1922, to May, 1923, the
sum of \$126,000 was received from 138
different cities in the Dominion at the
Head Office in Montreal. The ob-
ject for which this money is being
collected is to help the rebuilding of
Palestine, which accords to the fam-
ous Balfour Declaration, the Jewish
people are given the opportunity of
establishing there a Jewish homeland.
Great Britain, having granted the
mandate over the land, considered the
actual situation, resulting from ex-
perience regard such a sum, collected
during the given period as an achieve-
ment and the breaking of the Jewish
efficient propaganda carried on by the
Zionist Organization in Canada. The
Canadian Federation has the distinc-
tion of being counted second on the
list of activities and pro-capita re-
turns among the Zionist Federations
of the world. The Canadian Organi-
zation has its branches all over the
Dominion counting about two hundred
cities in which groups of affiliation
exist.
