**All Veteran Societies to be One**

Convention in Toronto on Victoria Day  
A convention of Veterans was held on May 24, Victoria Day, at Toronto, for the purpose of amalgamating all Veteran Societies in one organization.  
Sixty-three credentialed delegates attended from all over the Province, the purpose of attending. Deep interest was manifested. Much dissatisfaction was expressed at the meeting respecting the manner in which both the International Government and the present one had handled the returned soldiers' question. Strongly worded resolutions were carried urging the Government to take immediate action on all matters affecting returned soldiers.  
Frank McNall, told of the indifference and open hostility on the part of officials and Parliamentary representatives towards returned soldiers.  
Col. A. T. Hunter, presiding, urged for amalgamation which, after considerable debate, was adopted.
