Doctors Capps and Coleman kept tab on 3,423 ed into three classes:

cases of pneumonis, which were divid-1.-Abstainers and those who drank less than two glasses of heer daily. 3.-Those who drank more than this but were still definitely moderate

3.-Regular and heavy drinkers. "It was found that the mortality was considerably higher in moderate users than in light users or abstainers, and that the mortality in excessive users was much higher than in moderate Users."
