THE DRY ROT OF POTATOES

The dry rot is common in stored prevalent in cellars and store houses usually wrinkled and white mouldy growths are often present. When the potato is cut open cavities are often present in the decayed part. There is usually no unpleasant odor, which accompanies rots caused by bacteris. 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
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
