Highway Traffic Act Passed in 1923 Is Now in Force

Numerous Important Changes in the Law Governing Motorizing

INTOXICATED PERSONS NOT TO DRIVE MOTOR VEHICLES. PERMITS CANCELLED FOR THIS OFFENCE

"The Highway Traffic Act of 1923" is the short title of the Act that amends, co-ordinates and consolidates the provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act, Travel and Road Safety Act, and other acts relating to the highway traffic in Ontario. The new Act came into force December 31, 1923.

There are many important changes from the old Act governing the use of the highway. In order to fully inform motorists, and thereby save them much inconvenience and possibly a few fines, below is a few of the more important revisions and additions to the law.

The Ontario Motor League points out that in a general sense the whole code of laws which regulates the operation of motor vehicles on the highway is now more improved and revised than ever before.
