The Text Explained

1 Kings 12: 12—The revolt of the northern tribes.—The narrative opens abruptly with the mention of Solomon's death and the visit to Shechem by the assembled tribes. The king had been convened under circumstances which were not related, for the purpose of confirming the accession. A deputation had come to him from the tribes, asking that he would give them the allegiance of the people, but only on condition that the oppressive yoke of Solomon's government be lifted; and so the king gave them an answer which has become famous.
