The Public Health

CITIZENS ARE REQUESTED TO
COMPLY WITH THE PUBLIC
HEALTH ACT

Notice is hereby given that all resi-
dents of Acton are required forthwith
to clean their cellars, drains, yards,
piles of brush, old lumber, stones and
other premises, and remove therefrom
all dirt, manure, and other sub-
stances which may render public
health dangerous or unhygienic.
We have the same command
by the twelfth day of May next,
which day the Sanitary Inspector
will be at our office to inspect and
further take notice that the section of
the Public Health Act prohibiting
the keeping of swine within the
limits of the town, will be in effect
May and the 15th of November, ex-
cept in pens at least 70 feet from any
dwelling house, and with doors kept closed
from all standing water and regularly
cleaned, will be strictly enforced.

All citizens are earnestly requested
to keep their premises constantly clean
and thoroughly disinfected.
