WHAT WE SHOULD EXPECT GOLDEN TEXT—John 4: 46-54.

THE TEXT EXPLAINED

Verse 46—Galilee—The province in which Jesus had spent his boyhood years. Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea, the gospel writers always referred to him as a Galilean. Early in his ministry Jesus had left Galilee and spent some time in Judaea. When he returned his reputation was great enough to overcome local prejudice and at first the Galileans received him warmly.

Verse 48—Except ye see—The Samaritans believed "because of his word." Jesus was always grieved to find that his own people asked for "signs and wonders."

Verse 49—Come down—The nobleman believed the presence of Jesus necessary to the healing of the child.

Verse 50—Thy son liveth—The nobleman who asked Jesus to come down to Capernaum, some twenty miles distant, and heal his son who was at the point of death.

Verse 51, 52—Evidently the father brought Jesus through the night, and the next morning, his servant bringing the news of his son's recovery.

Verse 53—And himself believed and his whole house—Thus was won a family of believers. They recognized the hand of God in that which had taken place in their home.

Lesson Themes

The Life-Giving Presence Everywhere—Jesus was in Galilee where he performed his first miracle. At this point he was visited by a certain nobleman who asked him to come down to Capernaum, some twenty miles distant, and heal his son who was at the point of death.

The blessing of the Household—It was a natural result of the miracle that the home of the nobleman should share in its blessing. It is stated that "he himself believed, and his whole household."

For Study and Discussion
