Police Court News

At Brampton last Wednesday J. J. Robbins of the Streetwise Hotel was charged before Police Magistrate Moore, by Constable Lees of that unit, with violating the Ontario Temperance Act. Evidence was shown that four bottles of Goodman & Sons' Whiskey had been discovered in his room. The Rev. Mr. McLean, bartender, had been seen near the place of hiding and to the hotel several times during the Sunday the officer seized the liquor. Robbins was fined \$200 and costs. Despite the two months having been caught with whiskey in the hotel by Inspector Beavenly.

At a session of the Police Court held at the Court House, Milton last Friday, Wm. Farlow pleaded guilty to being intoxicated, and was fined \$10 by Chief Chapman. A fine of \$100 and costs was imposed. Another charge against Farlow, for being intoxicated while driving a motor car was dismissed. The information not having been laid within the ten days required by the Highway Traffic Act.

A charge against George Morley for being intoxicated was also dismissed at the same sitting of the court for lack of corroborative evidence.

While in the Court Room, Morley was served with a summons for violation of the Highway Traffic Act, presented by Mr. Thompson. Morley pleaded guilty to this charge and was fined \$50 and costs.

At Brampton on Monday Robert Young of Mono Mills, was charged before Police Magistrate Moore, by Inspector Newell, who was staying in his hotel. Liquor was found in the dresser in two upstairs bedrooms. This was confiscated and a penalty of \$100 and costs imposed. W. H. Morris, prosecuted, and C. E. McLean, M. P. P. Oranville defended the accusation.
