To Try Entrance Exams. Jeanne was one of the many chil-dren in New Ontario who travel miles each day to achdol. Fair weather or foul, they trudge along the rough roads eager, for the little bit of edu-cation possible for them. Fifteen years had passed since Jeanno's birth and she had never enjoyed the best of health during that time. Six of these years she had spent in going to school, helping around the house and at odd times working here and there to carn a little money. One day she was caught in a sleet storm on her way home from school. Before long a terrible cough set in. which finally ended in Consumption. Of course, it was impossible for her to try the entrance examinations. "Another year, perhaps, but certainly not now," said the doctor.
