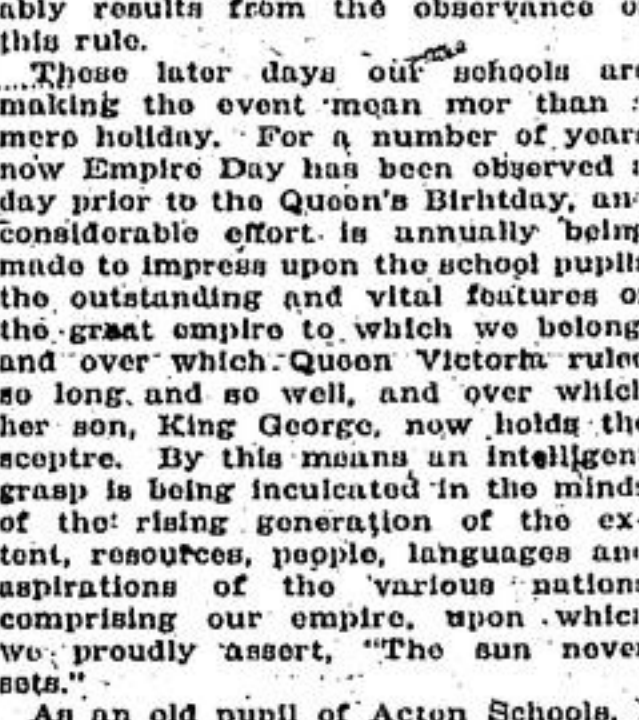
Much desperate fighting had gone on

CHANGES IN MARRIAGE LICENSE LAW

Age of Bride Must be Proven by Af-
fidavit and License Secured Three
Days
According to an amendment to the
Marriage Act passed by the Provincial
Legislature and becoming effective on
June 1st, 1926, before a marriage
license can be issued the date and the
place of birth of the party other than
the applicant for the license must be
proven by means of the production of
the birth certificate, or an affidavit
made by said other party, or a member
of the family to which she belongs.
