REVIEW

Golden Text—Ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. Acts 1: 8.

COD LIVER OIL IN CHICK FEED

An experiment was conducted at the Canadian Experiment Station, Ottawa, in 1924 to determine the effect of the various vitamins rich feeds in the feeding of chicks.

The other 13 pens were all fed this same ration, with the exception of the pen which was recognized as being high in vitamins. The additional feed used were, wheat germ, rice bran, and yeast (a yeast prepared for feeding purposes) Fleischmann's yeast (a living yeast) tomato pulp, cod liver oil, etc.

At the end of the experiment, which lasted three weeks, pen 4, the lot on cod liver oil, showed the highest gain.

As these results are but confirmation of previous work at this Farm, the conclusion is that cod liver oil should be prevented or cured in growing chicks by the use of cod liver oil—G. Robertson Assistant Dominion Poultry Husbandman.
