1. Paul Forbidden to preach in Asia. "Asia" here means the Roman Province of Asia. This propably seemed strange to Paul, but he wisely obeyed and asked no-questions. If we would speak the right word, in the right place, at the right time, we must look to the Holy Spirit for His guidance, and Ho will give it. The time came later for Paul to peak the Word in Asia and wonder; ful results followed (chapter 19: 1, 1 10 26 27). But though Paul obeyed the Spirit and did not speak the Word in Asia, he did not give up preaching. As the Spirit would not suffer him to speak in one place, he went to another. The Word was a fire in Paut's bones, and he must speak somewhere. It is well to note that Paul did no need the guidance of the Spirit to set him to preaching, but to keep him from it (cf. verse 7). 


