told in the officer's own words:

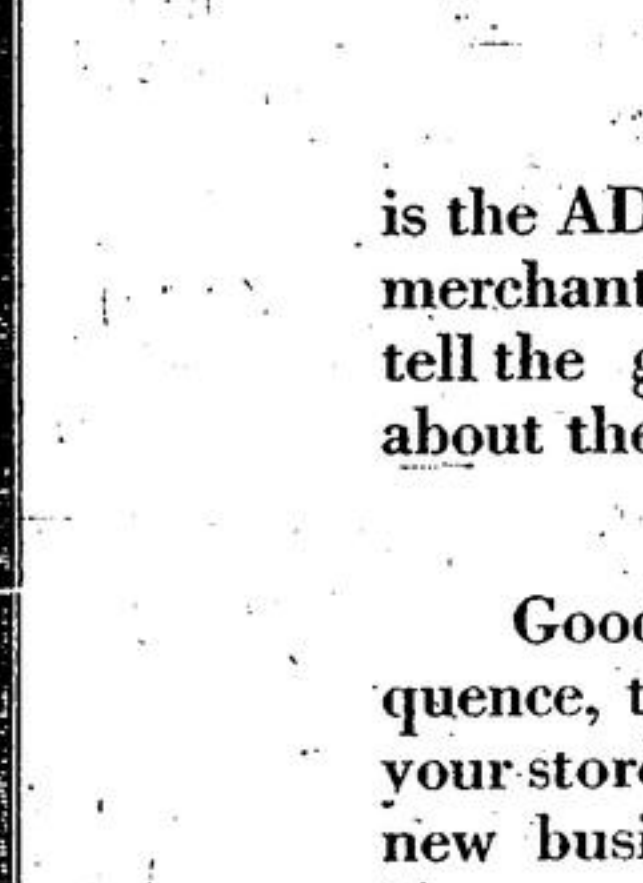
GEM OF THOUGHT
