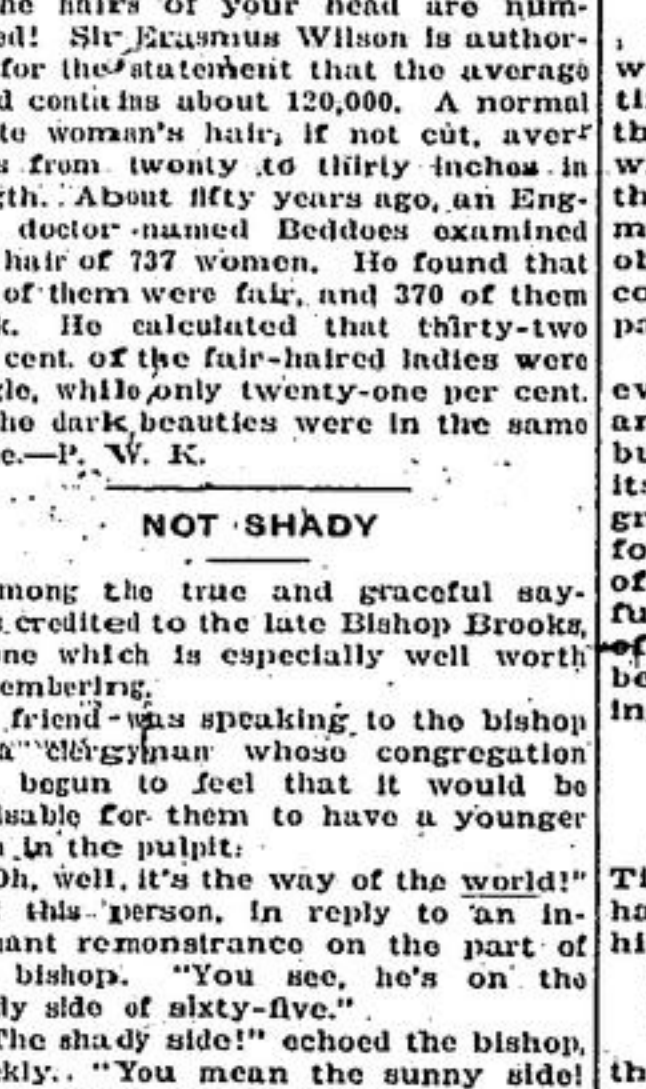
NO LONGER ON THE MAP
