GROWING ALFALFA In many sections of Canada, alfalfa is rapidly becoming an important farm The farmers in these provinces are quite aware of the merits of this crop, to grow it have met with complete or partial failure. However, experimental work with alfalfa, at the Fredericton Experimental Station, has demonstrated that it can be grown successfully if conditions are made favorable to its development.

While alfalfa prefers a rich, clay, loam soil, it will do well on most deep soils, provided they are well drained, reasonably free of weeds and in a good state of fertility. 
