FOX THEFT TRIAL NEXT MONDAY

Phil Forbes and Howard Martin Arrested at Holland Landing; Felts Discovered on Sunday

PHIL FORBES and Howard Martin, who succeeded in eluding the Provincial Constables when Forbes' home was being approached through the deep snows on Friday night, were captured last Friday at Holland Landing. They were brought to Milton and landed in the county gaol.

Local constables, provincial Constables Owens, Butler and Allan, who had never given up the search for the thieves and the valuable fur pelts, discovered a number of the skins, which were secreted in a hole in the snow, and the two men who are now in custody are those who are charged with the theft. Phil Forbes and Gordon Gallagher of Espanola, near Guelph, and also a teamster from Galtown, Russell Hamilton and Oscar Tebow, Guelph, and Elliott Tewes, of Buffalo.

The case so thoroughly cleaned up, so far as the police are concerned, was in charge of Chief Justice John Miller of Toronto, who speaks highly of the work of the Provincial Constabiles of Ontario, Butler, of Oakville, and Allan of Galtown, who have been involved in a number of all-night vigils in some of the roughest weather of the winter, and two of the accused were held in custody after a night chase over rocky and snow-covered country in Nassagawaya.

The prisoners were called into court yesterday morning, but the trial was adjourned by Mr. W. J. McClelland, J. P., for a week to permit the crown to complete their evidence against the accused. There were 250 spectators present to hear the trial. The trial was before Justice Police Magistrate H. P. Moon at the Court House, Milton, on Monday afternoon next, 19th inst., at 1:30 p.m. This will be the first trial of its kind in Halton County.

The foxes, which belonged to J. O. Nicholson, of Kilburn, were valued at approximately \$2,500 for breeding purposes. A sum of \$1,500 was recovered after worth \$1,500 to 2,000.
