LESSON

FOUR SUNDAY, APRIL 8

General Lesson Title: The Resurrection.
Bible Lesson: Matthew 28: 1-10.

Golden Text: Because I live, ye shall
live also. John 14: 9.

Devotional Reading: Rom. 8: 34-39.

The Text Explained

1. When the Sabbath was past—the
Sabbath ended at sundown on Saturday.

2. Mary Magdalene, Miriam of Magdala,
Magdala was probably a village near
Tiberias, now known as el-Mejdel.

3. There is no real evidence to identify her
other than the name—she was
annointed Jesus' feet (Luke 7: 36-50) or
with Mary of Bethany, the sister of
Lazarus and Lazarus. Our actual knowl-
edge of Mary Magdalene is practically
limited to her experiences at the time of
our Lord's resurrection. Mary the
mother of James. She is also spoken of as
the mother of Jesus (see Mark 15: 40 and
16: 7-9). She is probably the same as
the Mary the wife of Clopas (see John 19:
25). There is a possibility that she was
a sister of Mary the mother of Jesus.

4. This possibility lies in the words of
John 19: 25. They were standing by the
cross of Jesus His mother, and His
mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas,
and Mary Magdalene. There is, how-
ever, no way to establish the certainty as
to this possibility. In this sentence, James
is listing three women or four. Salome,
Hebrew, Shalom, "Peace." She was likely
the wife of Zebedee and the mother of
the apostles James and John. However,
this is not a certainty. Salome—Pragant
oil, used for anointing purposes.

5. A young man—An angelic mes-
senger. Luke says there were two angels.
It is possible that the women's
memory of the vision might be some-
what confused.

6. The words of the angel are given
very differently by Mark, Matthew, and
Luke. (see Matt. 28: 5-7; Mark 16:
6-7; Luke 24: 5-7.) As to the mean-
ing of the message, however, there is
perfect agreement.

7. Mark 16: 9-20 is regarded by practi-
cally all modern scholars as a later
addition to the original book. It is probable
that the last page of the original book of
Mark was written by a scribe at a
somewhat later date. (A. J. Maclean in
Hastings' Dictionary, p. 101, Dictionary,
pp. 732f. New Testament in Greek,
Westcott and Hort, Appendix.)

8. There verifies a summary of
Luke 24: 44-53.

Lesson Themes

1. The appearance of the risen Lord—the
accounts of our Lord's appearances and
references to such appearances are scat-
tered among various books in the New
Testament. No single writer mentions
all the appearances. We must therefore
gather our knowledge by gathering
the information that we have on this
subject and make for ourselves in the
best of the light of the occasion.

2. To the women who were present at
the tomb. Luke says there were two
angels. It is possible that the women's

Testing Children for Defective Hearing



The audiometer for determining the degree of hearing retained by deaf persons is one of the recent inventions of Bell Telephone Research Engineers. It has been found that to test the hearing of children in groups, rather than individually enables them to concentrate better on the hearing test. After the telephone receivers have been adjusted on the right ears of the children they are held to write down as many numbers as they can hear as the photograph letters they hear numbers coming from the telephone receiver, the intensity of each successive number group being three sensation units less than that of the preceding group. The receivers are then changed to the left ears and the test repeated. Children's hearing can be much benefited when defects are ascertained before it is too late.

GOOSE RAISING ON THE FARM.

Goose raising is a very profitable side line for the farmer. Essentials to success in this line of poultry farming are proper selection of breed and breeding stock, and feed range with an abundance of succulent green food. The breeds of geese recommended for the farmer are Toulouse, Embury or African. Experiment conducted at the Experimental Farm, Ottawa, have proven that the Toulouse is the most desirable breed.

USEFULNESS OF MAPS

When the art of printing was first utilized for the publication of books only a small portion of the population in any of the then civilized countries of the world could read and in fact it was a long time afterwards before people generally could use books for themselves. Nowadays more books are being sold than ever before, but people buy them to read and use. With better general education the greater is the demand for books at all kinds. The same may be said to be true of maps; as more people learn to use them, so does the demand increase, and it is equally true that one must learn to read a map and be able to use it, just as one must learn to read words before the printed page is of any significance. A map is not a word picture, nor is it a photograph, although it contains elements of both. Especially is it true of the topographic map which is the most complete example of map-making's skill and serves many purposes. It is the record of the natural and cultural features of any area, and one of the means of aiding development. Such a map shows the arable lands, industrial areas, mineral areas, water power sites and storage basins, reclamation projects, irrigation areas, surface conformation, etc.
