NEW BRIDGE AT OAKVILLE

Old One a Failure and Will Be Replaced by New Structure... Deputy Minister of Highways R. H. Smith informed the press yesterday that the Greenock bridge engineer is working on plans for a new concrete and steel structure...

The present bridge has been a source of dissatisfaction ever since it was built in 1912...

It is possible, however, that on account of the heavy traffic during the months of June, July and August that the beginning of the work may be postponed...

As a result of the trouble the original contract was cancelled and another contract was eventually given to the work on a cost plus ten per cent basis...

It was this that the bridge got off to a bad start and it has been a source of fault-finding ever since, much of which was unjustified.
