##### Scarlet Fever

During the past few years there has been a renewed interest in scarlet fever. It has been discovered that the scarlet fever bacteria gives the same epidemic results in the treatment of diphtheria. It has been found in the treatment of diphtheria with diphtheria antitoxin.

Scarlet fever is caused by a certain disease germ which lives off a certain cell in the throat, in some cases, kills, and in which all cases does more or less damage to the various organs of the body.

The scarlet fever antitoxin counteracts the toxin. Given early and in sufficient quantity it not only cures but prevents the damage which will be so serious.

Those who are responsible for the care of children should appreciate that the life of the child when attacked by scarlet fever, may depend upon every hour's delay in obtaining the life of the child.

In Canada there were 362 deaths from scarlet fever during 1926. This loss of human life is, of course, serious. In addition, there is a much larger number who recovered, some of whom are more or less permanently damaged.

Scarlet fever antitoxin, should be made freely and readily available throughout Canada for the saving and conserving of human life.

##### CARE OF THE CHICKENS ON RANGE

The simpler methods of feeding and caring for the chicks that can be adopted the better.

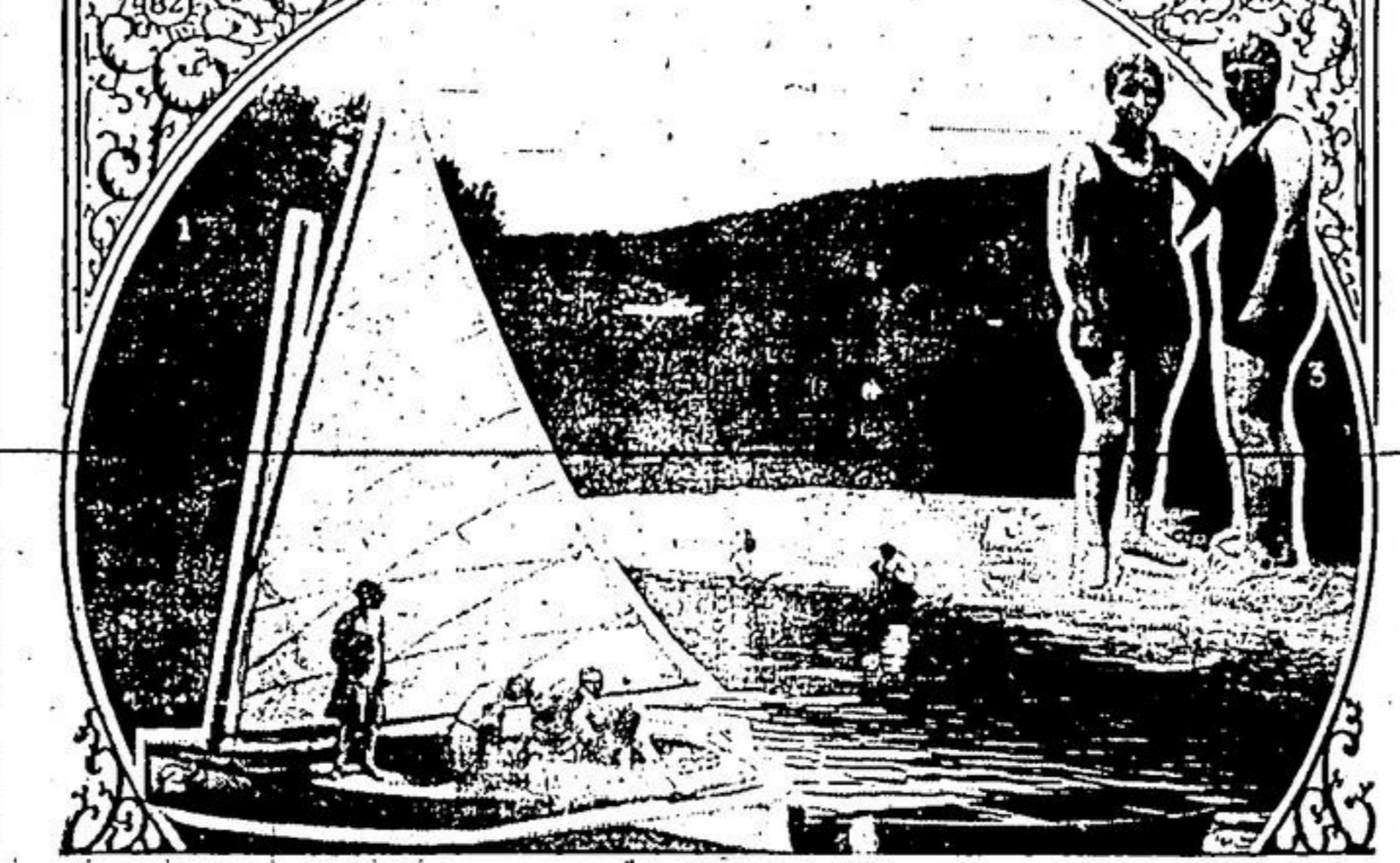
