For over nine years I have held the office of municipal clerk and treasurer, during which time I have done my best to execute the duties of same faithfully and efficiently. Relations between myself and the Council have, for the most part, up to the present, been of a friendly nature, and the affairs have run along smoothly.

However, during the last few weeks matter of the proposed waterworks, there have taken place events which have convinced me that it is not desirable for me to continue to execute the duties of this office longer.

As you know, I have lately been made the object of personal attack and un-called-for reprimands by the Council and by persons outside the Council who were invited by the Council to attend the meeting of July 17. I have, in the first place, been accused of advising the Council that the rate by-law was legal, and, in the second place, I was told that I had earned the reputation of being out to block all progress of measures by declaring them to be illegal, etc. It is to be noted that I am to be caught in the very act.

With regard to the first allegation, I should like to state that I have never given my opinion as to the legality of the by-law, or having been asked to do so, except in regard to the millage, before the vote was taken. The only time that I was ever asked to look into the matter of the legality was when the same bill was finally passed after the voting. I have never attended any of the meetings of the Council, and I am not supposed to offer my opinions unless they are asked for, as I have been reminded from certain quarters.
