Do not be in a hurry to move the patient; any movement may cause damage to an injured part. Keep the patient lying down, with the head low.

If a part is injured and clothing must be removed, cut off the clothing in preference to moving the injured part. After an injury, there is usually a condition of what is called shock. Shock ahould be treated by keeping the patient warm. Blankets or overcoats are placed under, over and around the patient. If possible, hot water bottles should be placed under the arm-pits and around the body, care being taken not to burn the patient. If the patient is conscious, give him a hot drink. 
