ROGUING THE SEED PLOT TO CONTROL MOSAIC OF POTATOES

The seed-plot is comparatively an old idea but during recent years it has been applied more generally to the control of mosaic which is known to effect serious reductions in yield. The Division of Botany, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, have demonstrated that this disease is kept under control by careful and constant roguing of the seed-plot, a method which is accepted as an established practice by the most successful producers of certified stock.
