TEACHERS' ANNUAL CONVENTION

OF Halton and Wentworth Inspectors Being Held To-day and To-morrow In Toronto

The annual convention of the Halton and Wentworth Inspectors of the Teachers' Institute is being held today and tomorrow in the Normal School at Toronto. There are morning and afternoon sessions each day.

Memorial Selections, Miss E. May, Dundas, Ontario; Miss L. M. Mclellan, Action, reports of O. E. A. Delaplane, Miss N. Hall, Esquinton, and Miss I. Mclellan, Wentworth. Programs are prepared for inspection, and an Inspector Period, with question drawer.
