On Wednesday evening, April 23, the
Town Council was well filled when the
Young People's League of the United
Church put on an interesting programme
with the pastor, Rev. M. E. Gandler,

dress, Mr. Gandler, who is president
of young musicians, who were also

which he is conductor, and the organ
choir, which he plans to have.

President McPherson reported that
the highway was ready and the
