You may have to give your knees particular attention, for they tire rapidly from the leg locking demanded by the rules for correct walking. Include some till climbing in your long walks. Walking down hill gives a peculiar strength to the knee joints. It comes from the strain thrown on them when the body's weight falls, as it were, and has to be checked by the muscles around the knees. Qoing up, because of the deliberation of the muscular contractions, is better for the acquirement of actual bulk; but the rough going of falling down gives the legs of grand, shewy toughness not to be duplicated in any other exercise.
