Recipes for New and Novel Dishes; Household Ideas and Suggestions

THOSE TASTY BAVARIANS Add Bavarian cream to your list of desserts. You will find it delicious, and healthful and economical.

BANANA BAVARIAN

1 package lemon-flavored gelatin. 1 pint boiling water. 1/4 teaspoon salt. 1/2 cup sugar. Juice 1 lemon. 1/2 cup cream. 5 bananas. Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. ...

APRICOT BAVARIAN

1 package strawberry-flavored gelatin. 1 pint boiling water and apricot juice. 1/2 cup cream. 1/2 pound dried apricots, cooked and drained. 1/2 cup sugar. Dissolve gelatin in boiling water and apricot juice. ...

BOILED SALAD DRESSING

(Makes 1 1/2 cups) 2 eggs. 4 tablespoons flour. 2 tablespoons sugar. 1 teaspoon salt. 1/2 teaspoon mustard. 1/4 teaspoon paprika. 1 1/2 cups cold water. 1 tablespoon butter. 1/2 cup lemon juice. Beat eggs slightly. Stir in all dry ingredients. ...

BAKED ORANGE RELISH FOR MEAT

(Serves 6-8) 2 large oranges. 3 or 4 slices canned pineapple. 1 teaspoon cinnamon. 8 whole cloves. 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg. 1/2 cup pineapple juice. 1/2 cup sugar. 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Slice oranges thin, using skin and pulp. ...

BITTER ORANGE MARMALADE

(Makes 6-8 glasses) 1 grapefruit. 2 oranges. 1 lemon. 1/4 cup lemon juice. Slice unpeeled fruit very thin. Add three times as much water as fruit. ...
