PROTECTING FRUIT TREES FROM MICE AND RABBITS

Although the advice to protect fruit trees from mice and rabbits during the winter months has often been given by the Experimental Farm, Ottawa, to those having young trees, the warning cannot be given too often that if trees are left unprotected one may find his trees girdled in the spring and injured beyond recovery or else so much injured that they have received a severe setback.

Usually work along the surface of the soil under the snow. If there is any, and attack the bark of the tree close to the ground. The rabbits, on the other hand, work on top of the snow and it can be readily seen that, if the snow is two feet or more deep, there should be enough of the tree protected above the snow that the rabbits cannot reach the unprotected parts.

Repellent for Rabbits: Take one quart of linseed oil (either boiled or raw) and heat it to 470 degrees F. outdoors where no fire will be started by accident, because the oil may foam over. Use a container five times as large as the volume of the oil.

This thick sulphurated oil is about the right consistency to paint on tree trunks. Paint the trunk liberally to about two feet above the snow line. The trunk should be dry when the oil is applied.

MAKING A LIVING

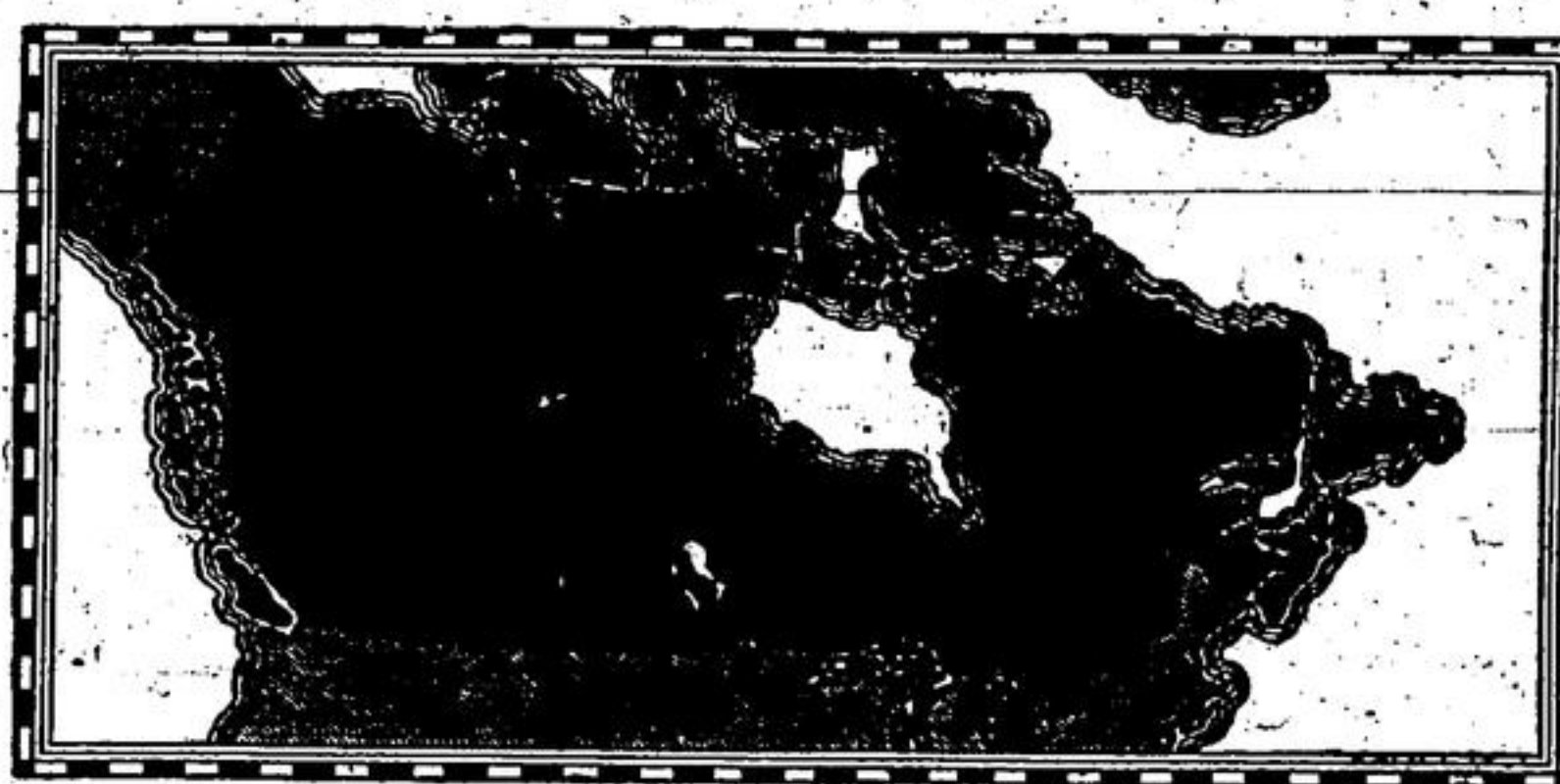
CONTROL OF MICE IN ORCHARDS

One of the greatest hazards in the growing of an apple orchard is the danger of girdling by mice. This is especially true in orchards under sod culture, although even orchards under clean cultivation are frequently subject to considerable damage from this cause.

The amount of damage caused by these animals varies greatly from year to year, depending largely upon their available supply of food. For this reason orchardists are prone to overlook the necessary precautionary measures, which would reduce this damage to a minimum.
