Soap companies and edible oil manufacturers in Canada use approximately \$4,000,000 of these commodities yearly. The establishment of a soya bean milling industry in eastto ern Canada is also being considered. The beans would be imported from northern Manchuria at the beginning and it would later be endeavored to grow crops
