(Serves 6) 2 cups cold roast lamb (veal, chicken or duck) 4 oranges Lettuce

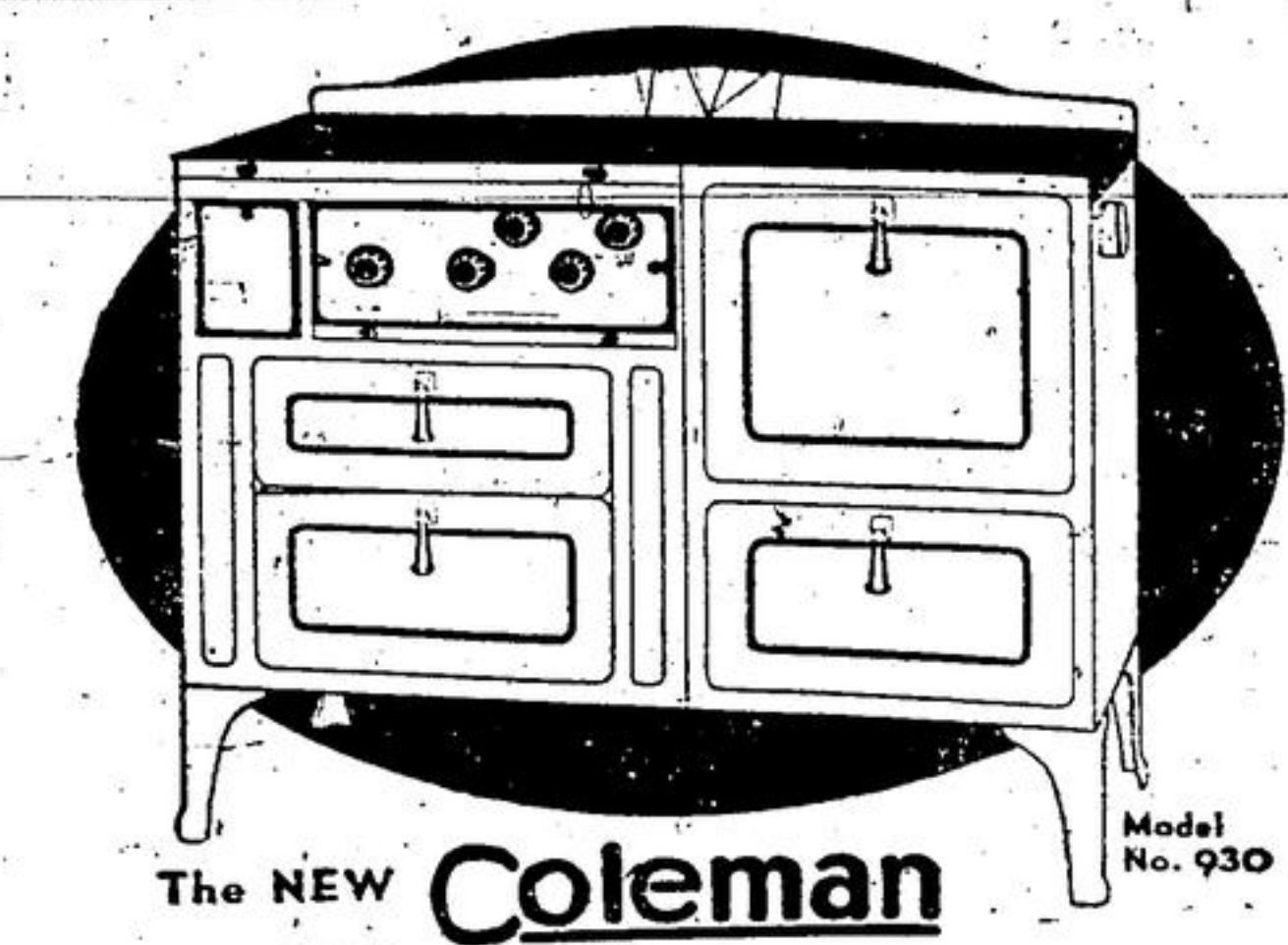
