ILLUSTRATE PRACTICAL HELP

A typical example of the practical work of the Illustration Stations of the Experimental Farms is afforded by the present-day up-to-date farm of Mr. W Michael in the Petersfield district Manitoba, Mr. Michael, who was marine engineer and knew little about farming, took up this farm in 1921. It was then in a neglected condition, the iwelling house and one storey barn illapidated, and only remnants of fences on the land which was polluted with low thistle, will oats and stinkweed. All his first and most of his second season's grain crop was ordered cut by the Provincial Weed Commissioner, and came under the notice of the Experimental Farms. In 1925 an Illustration Station was established on Mr. Michael's farm. A series of demonstrational fields, dealing with cultural methods, crops and rotations were laid out. During the first two years a great deal of the crop had to be cut early because of weed infestation, but to-day the whole farm is exceptionally clean, the farm house emodelled, a modern barn built, and the entire farm lenced in. Last season his herd of 11 cows produced an average of ,780 pounds of milk. By adopting a ropping scheme, including a forage crop. and by alternating alfalfa, grain and summer-fallow, Mr. Michael has transformed, in the period of 11 years, this very weedy property into a fine clean

Harold B. Johnson, President and Editor of the Watertown (N. Y.) Daily Times, says:

"Newspaper advertising is emerging from the depression with greater appeal than ever before. It requires fire and water, highwater, flood and famine, to bring out staying qualities. And fortunate indeed is that community or locality that has a strong newspaper that stood up vigorous, alert, unafraid, throughout the depression, to present itself as an avenue of advertising now in this movement of rehabilitation.

The newspapers contributed more than any other agency toward steadying our people throughout the depression. If it had not been for a free, independent, courageous press that gave the facts and commented honestly we might have gone most anywhere. But we now come out of it all, recognizing in full measure the value of the newspaper during the past for four years as an institution of enlightenment, opinion and dissemination of fact, and appreciating the medium it presents for advertising in this period when we are all striving toward rebuilding and for full measure of prosperity again."
