MIXED CONSERVES

Try mixing your fruits when preserving and canning this season. Many delicious jars may be made from such combinations—jars filled with quick-energy from the sugar and healthful vitamins from the fruits:

BLUEBERRY AND APPLE CONSERVE

- 2 cups blueberries
2 cups tart apples sliced
3 cups sugar
1/2 cup nut meats, chopped
Rind of one-half lemon
Juice of 1 lemon, grated

Combine all the ingredients except the nut meats. Cook until the mixture is thick and clear. Add the nut meats just before taking from the fire. Pour into hot, clean glasses. Seal tight.

CHERRY AND CURRANT CONSERVE

- 1 quart currants
2 quarts pitted sour cherries
1 pound sugar for each pound fruit

Weigh the fruit. Mix with the sugar. Let stand over night. In the morning, cook the mixture until it is thick and clear. Pour into sterilized jelly glasses. Cover with paraffin.

SUMMER COCKTAIL

- (Serves 8-10)
1/2 cup lemon juice
1/2 cup orange juice
1/2 cup grapefruit juice
1/2 cup sugar
Few grains salt
1 cup mineral water
Cracked ice
Mint sprigs

Combine first six ingredients and serve over ice in cocktail glasses, garnished with mint sprigs.

TOAST BROWNIE

- (Serves 6)
1/2 cup orange juice
Grated rind 1 orange
1/4 cup sugar
6 slices toast

Mix orange juice, rind and sugar well and spread on hot buttered toast. Put in oven or under broiler to brown. Toast may be cut in fancy shapes.

A NOVEL BETTY BROWN

Here is one solution for the problem of providing a dessert which is good for the children and is eaten with equal enjoyment by the grown-ups.

BROWN BETTY PUDDING

- 3 large apples, cored, pared and thinly sliced
4 tablespoons granulated sugar
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
6 tablespoons butter
1/2 teaspoon brown sugar,
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 cups cereal flakes

Arrange apples in greased baking dish and sprinkle with mixture of granulated sugar and cinnamon. Dot with 1 tablespoon butter. Cream remaining butter, add brown sugar gradually and cream together thoroughly. Add salt and crisp cereal flakes, and mix well. Spread lightly over apples. Bake, covered, in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 30 minutes, then remove cover and continue baking 15 minutes longer, or until apples are tender. Serve warm with whipped cream or hard sauce. Serves 6.

ORANGE MALTED MILK

- (Serves 1)
1 tablespoon malted milk powder
1/2 cup boiling water
1/2 cup cold water
2 tablespoons orange juice
Cracked ice

Mix malted milk powder with boiling water and orange juice, strain over cracked ice into glass.
