"WHITE" AND "BLACK" ALKALI

Jack Miner, Canada's Best-known Bird-lover and Naturalist, Elgerville, Ontario, Condemns This Newcomer - A Weed-seed Distributor and Killer of Valuable Trees, He Says

Yes, it's the bird we call the English Starling. Now, readers, I want to draw near to one and all and say from the bottom of my heart that it is not my intention to be insulting to any nationality.

Let us keep in mind we are part of the British Empire and these two undesirable species of birds are not a bit more English than they are French, German or Italian.

While I had seen thousands of them in Southeastern Pennsylvania and the New England States, I had not seen one in Canada until 1924. In January, 1925, three came to our sanctuary, and to tell the whole truth I rather welcomed them; but in 1927 and 1928 they began to wear out their welcome for they ate up all the bob-white quail-foed-I had hanging about the premises.

In July, 1931, we declared war on them and built a starting net or trap, and by September first we had caught, drowned and buried over 17,000; but bless your life there was a million came to their aid.

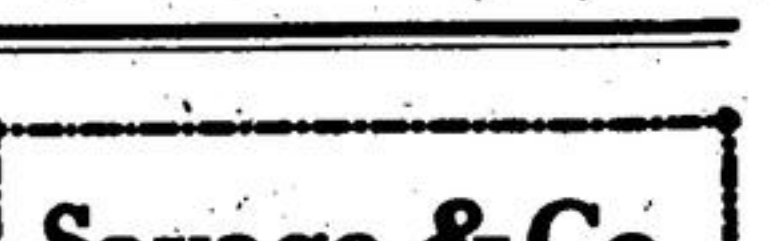
