### CANADA'S FAR-FLUNG OUTPOSTS

The annual expedition of officials of the Canadian Government is en route to the islands of Canada's Arctic archipelago, which are part of the Northwest Territories. These Territories, together with the Yukon Territory, are, if size is considered, virtually a continent in themselves for they extend over 1,309,682, square miles. They embrace all of the mainland of Canada west of Hudson Bay and north of the 60th parallel of latitude; all of the islands in Hudson and the bob-white quail-food I had hanging James Bays, and in Hudson Straits; and about the premises. Think of it, readers, are Eskimos, 4,046 Indians and 1,007 white inhabitants.

The administration of the Northwest Territories comes under a Commissioner. Deputy Commissioner and five councillors. appointed by the Government of Canada. This year's expedition will again visit are occupying the woodpeckers' cavities the posts in the Farthest North where members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are stationed. Officers and men who have been at these posts for a year or more will be relieved. While the specially chartered ship which is carrying the expedition is calling at the police posts, scientists will be landed at different points to enable them to make a survey of native and wild life, to study plant life, mineral occurrences and other features of scientific interest. Eighteen ports will be visited by the expedition. The outward and homeward journey will cover about 12,000 miles.

It is only in recent years, or since the introduction of air transportation, that something of the true value of the Mineral deposits of the Northwest Territories has been definitely disclosed. Early in 1930 rich veins of pitchblende, from which radium is extracted, and silver ores were found on the eastern shore of Great Bear Lake. About a year later a further discovery of native silver deposits was made about seven miles from the original discovery. At the end of 1932 Great Bear Lake. Coal has been discovered on the western side of Great Bear Lake and an oil refinery has been established in the vicinity of Norman. Deposits of copper have been discovered in the Coppermine River district and icad and zinc in considerable quantities near Great Slave Lake, and nickel at Rankin inlet. Development of these mineral resources, owing to the districts in which they exist being so far from established routes of transportation, will prove exceedingly expensive for some time to come. 
