Sold Flour to 79 Countries

Flour ground from Canadian wheat, regarded as the world's standard of quality, was exported in 1933 to 79 countries. The total shipments amounted to 5,570,424 barrels valued at \$19,016,758 compared with 5,131,781 barrels in 1932, worth \$17,182,775.
