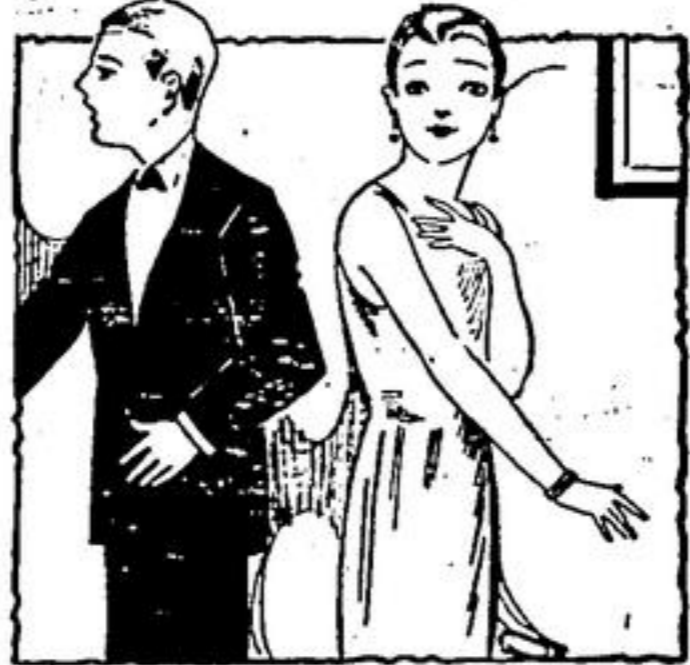
In writing this week's Chronicle I want to go back a week and tell you about my interesting week-end.

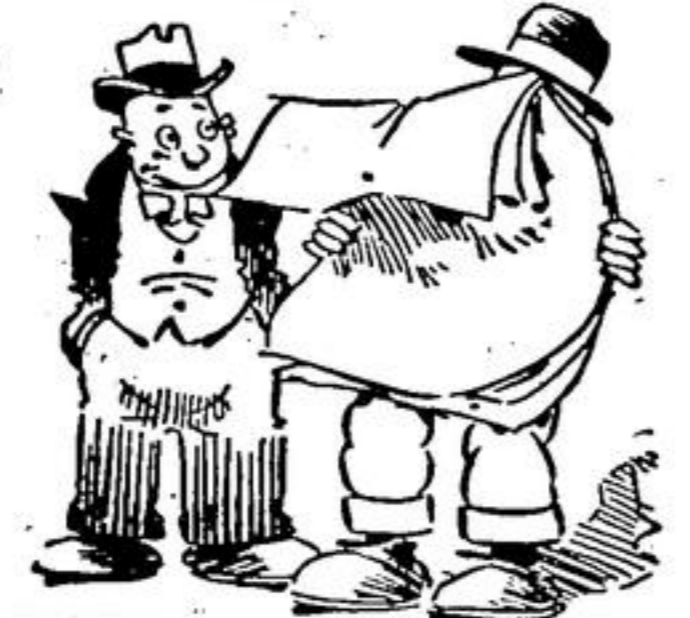

Fall Field Work on the Central Farm? Fall work is well advanced at the Central Experimental Farm.

The Egg Laying Contest? Egg production in the Canadian Egg Laying Contest at the Central Experimental Farm this year has been uniformly high.

Fish Meal for Poultry? The results of an experiment conducted for five years at the Dominion Experimental Farm at Nappan, N.S., show that fish meal is an excellent substitute for other protein feeds for poultry.

Winter Food Supply for Bees? Every colony of bees when ready for the winter should have at least forty pounds of food stored in order that they may have sufficient to carry them through until new nectar is available.
