Time—A net running time of 290 hours, 13 minutes was obtained, with an average speed of 25.6 miles per hour. Gasoline—During the run 476 gallons of gasoline were consumed or an average of 21.75 per gallon. Oil—Oil, over and above regular changes. Oil was changed every 1,000 miles. Water—Only a total of 5 1/2 quarts of water were added to the radiator during the whole 10,354 mile trip.
