MARRIAGES

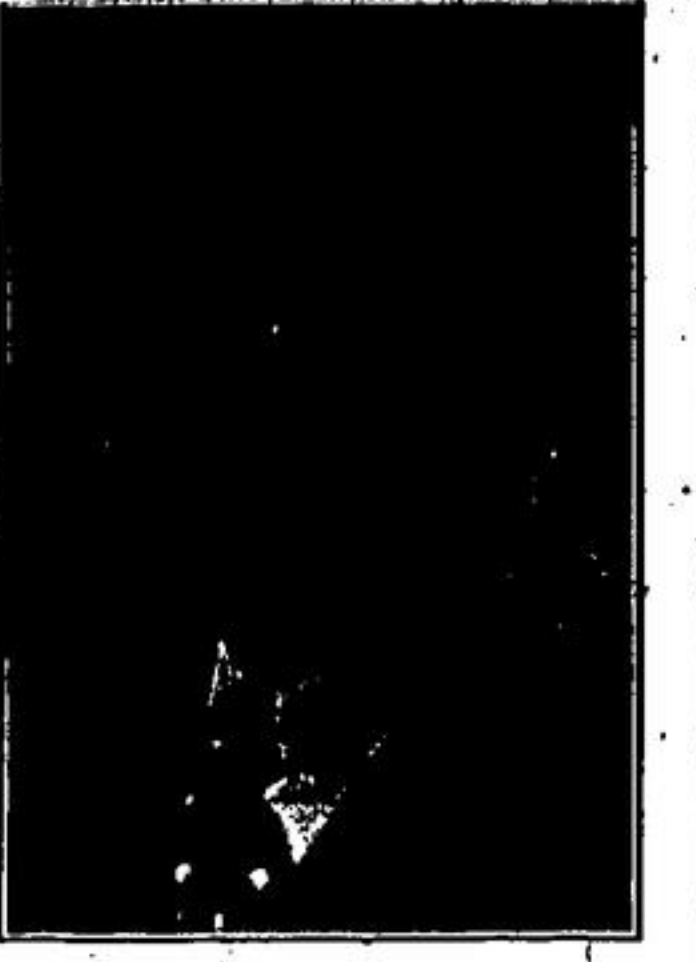
