TUBERCULOSIS IN ONTARIO

According to Dr. Neil McKinnon, of the School of Hygiene, Toronto, tuberculosis is still a problem in the Province of Ontario.

Of the 1,303 deaths, 60% were contributed by the age group 15 to 49, the majority of these by the age groups 20 to 35.

This being so, it means that the rising generation, including medical students, nurses in training, young adults and even school children are more apt to die from tuberculosis, before they reach 50, than from any other disease.

Tuberculosis is a "catching" disease. It spreads from person to person in the household.

Tuberculosis spreads not in families only; it spreads in schools, in industrial concerns, in the wards of hospitals among pupil nurses; its incidence in gaols and mental hospitals is notorious.

One thinks that the best method of control is the discovery of the infection in its earliest stages; in the children before adult tuberculosis is reached.
