## Tourists Spend 300 Millions

Canada's tourist traffic this year had a value of \$300,000,000, D. Leo Dolan, Director of the Dominion Tourist Bureau, told delegates to the Sixth Annual Conference of Tourist Associations and Publicity Bureaus in Ottawa. This represented an influx into Canada of 15,000,000 visitors for the first nine months of the calendar year. If the 1936 rate was maintained, then the final figures for the year would be in the neighborhood of 19,000,000 persons, said Mr. Dolan.

Dealing with the Dominion branch, Mr. Dolan said that he had 75,196 enquiries this year, which was an increase of 42.7 per cent. over 1936, and of 183.5 per cent. over 1935. A questionnaire sent to 42,000 tourists had resulted in nearly 4,000 replies. 
