Thebaud, to a series of races off Boston, next August for the International Fishermen's Trophy. In all probability the contest will be the last of its kind, as power engines are quickly displacing sails in the Atlantic fishing fleets. The Thebaud defeated the Bluenose in 1930, but Captain Walters regained the crown for Canada the following year.
