CANCER FROM DYES

As far back as 1895 cancer in dye workers was reported. A few years later investigations were started to find that cancer was 33 times as common in dye workers as in other men.

The route of entry of the dye is through the lungs, the skin and the digestive tract. The most important of these avenues of entrance is by way of the lungs in the form of dust and fumes.

One large dye firm in the United States has been so seriously disturbed by the frequency with which this form of cancer has appeared among their employees.

CANADIAN INVENTS INSULATING SILK

Silk insulation that exhibits 13 1/2 to 17 times more electrical resistance than ordinary silk is revealed in a patent granted at Washington, D.C. to Alfred C. Goodfellow of Toronto.

The inventor has discovered that silk of such high insulating value can be obtained by treating the material with dry steam.
