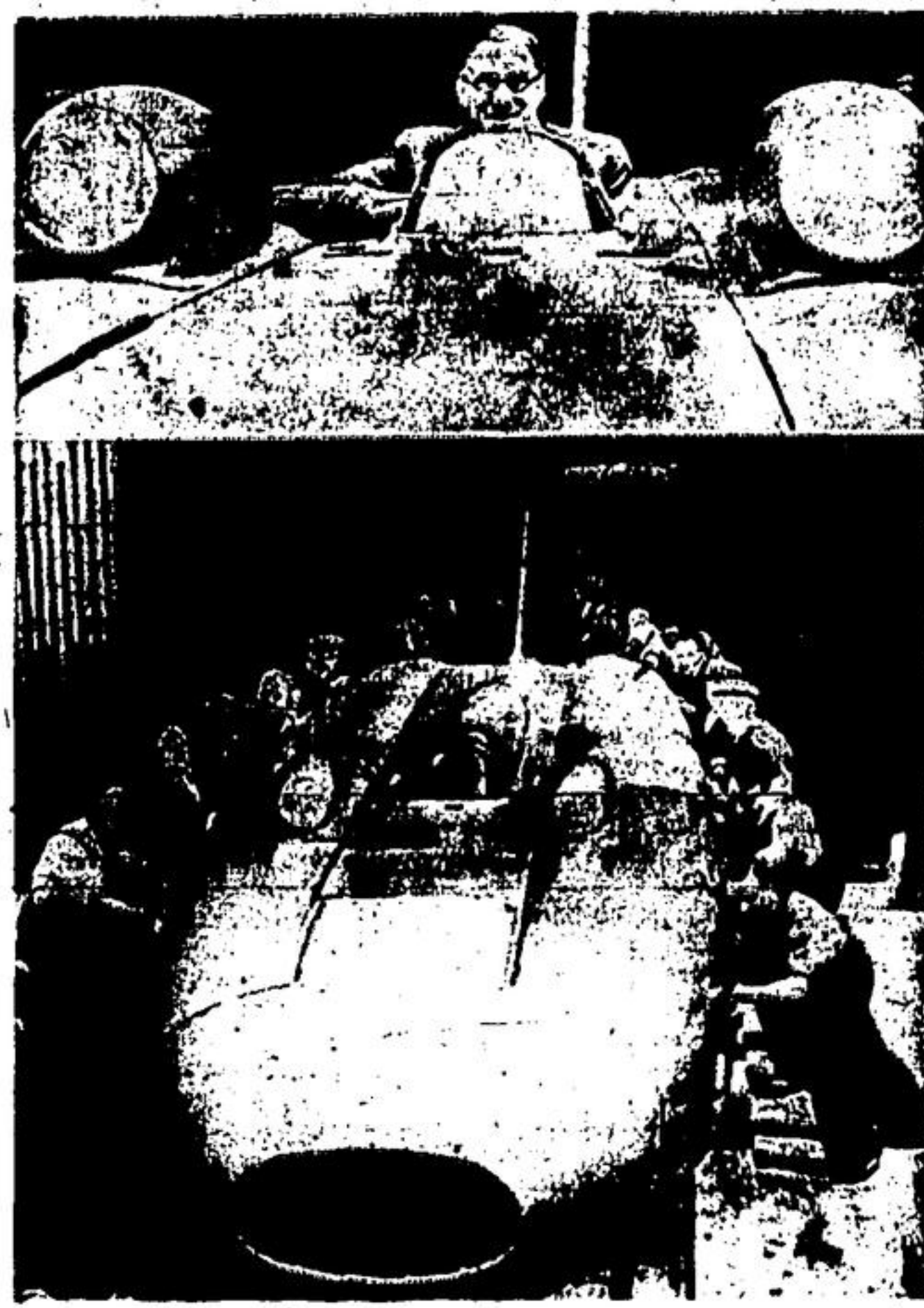
In readiness for your brother, Arleen. The proper evening clothes, I mean." "Well, Long and Cranshaw have his measures. They can send up some for me."
