Dean of Niagara Addressed Crowd at Harvest Supper

A. Sawyer, who, with Mrs. Sawyer, was among the guests at the supper. The audience sat spell-bound as the speaker presented a word vision of enlightened churchmanship. We hear a great deal of criticism of the church from all sorts of people, and while it is true that it is the easiest thing in the world to criticize, requiring neither brains nor knowledge, we do well to listen to it and we need never fear it. We have nothing to fear from the spirit of ignorance among our own members. We need a better understanding of what the Church is. We are here not to coddle our souls but to sell the idea of Christian churchmanship to a non-Church-minded world and to that end we must be people who believe in Him whom we profess to love.

There is too much respectability in the Church and too little Christianity and the world fails to see much value in it. We must show the world that we are learners sitting at the feet of Christ, we must show the world that we are consistent worshippers. Church attendance is not worshipping. Worship is a reaching out to touch that Presence which is Divine. We must not go to church and fail to do that which we must not fail to do it any single day of our lives.

The Dean closed his address with a home-made parable. As you drive along the highway he said, part of the stream of life, that passes over it, above your head another life is being carried on over the wires. Between the poles the wires sag and the amount of sag depends upon how far apart the poles are. The parable is this: "Our life as Christians is held above the worldly plane by the poles of prayer and worship and when we sag towards lower things it is because the poles of prayer are too far apart." If we have due influence as Christians, the poles of prayer must be so close together that there is no sag in our lives, and then the world will lack opportunity to criticize.

The Hall was attractively decorated with flowers and autumn leaves and a very delicious supper was served by the ladies, who were thanked for their efforts by the Rev. Allen Hill.

A vote of thanks to the Dean was moved by Dr. R. B. Walter of Rockwood. Also present was Mr. Fred Hamilton, the other Rockwood warden and several others from St. John's. Community singing was led by Mr. S. H. Webster, accompanied by Mrs. S. Snow. The Rev. E. A. Brooks presided.
