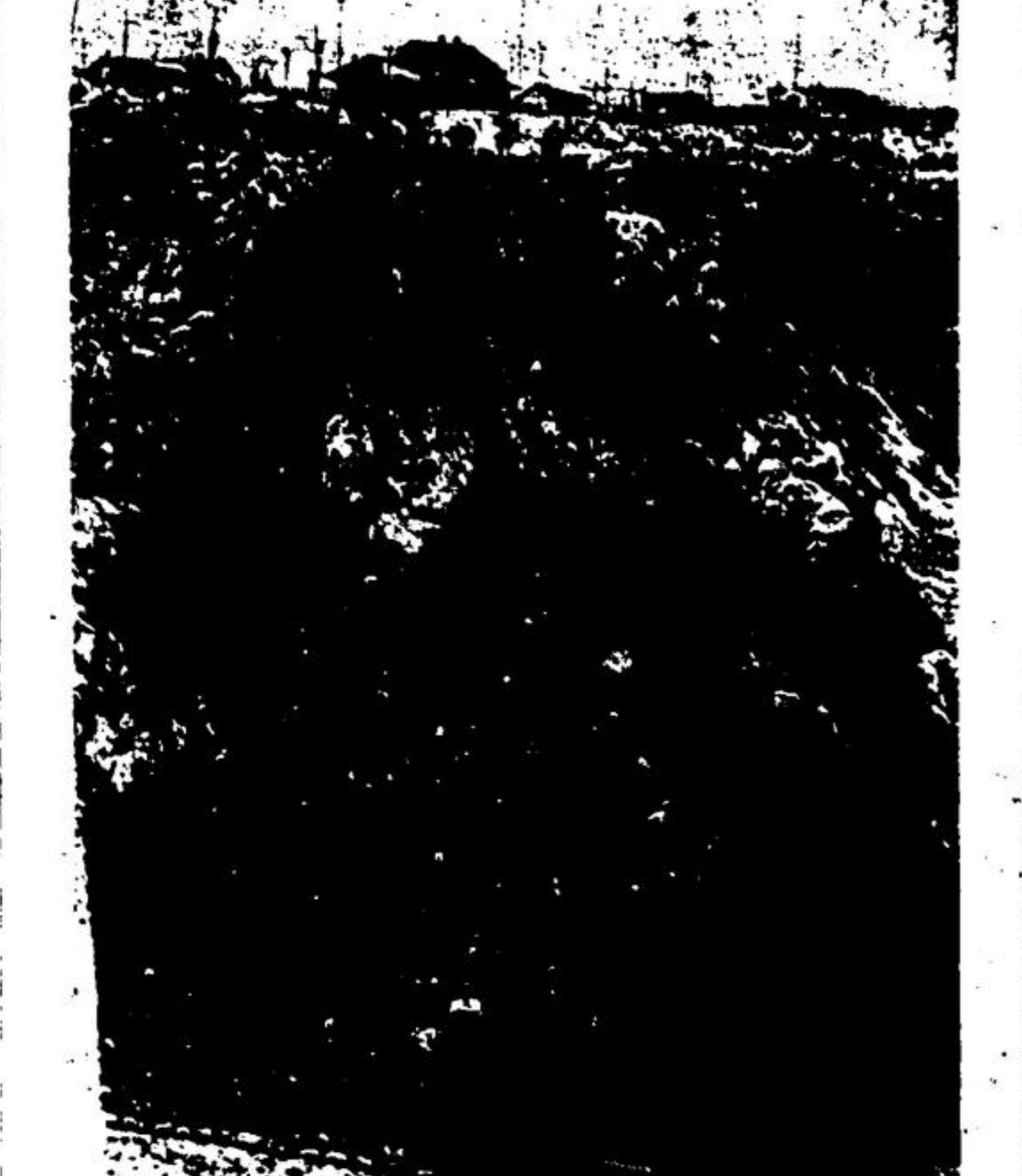
NASSAGAWEYA

Seven miners lost their lives in a rock slide at a 60-year-old asbestos mine at Theford Mines, Quebec. Hundreds of men, under the direction of experts, labored to remove the tons of debris which blocked the entrance of a 1,500-foot tunnel in which the miners were working at the time of the slide.
