How the Mine Patrol Works



This drawing illustrates how a warship clears the sea of the mines which have sunk scores of Allied and neutral vessels. Paravanes are towed from the stern, one on each side, five feet below the surface. If the tow cable encounters a mine chain, the latter slides to the paravane, slips off and is severed by the cutter blade. The mine then floats to the surface and is destroyed by gunfire.
