MILTON

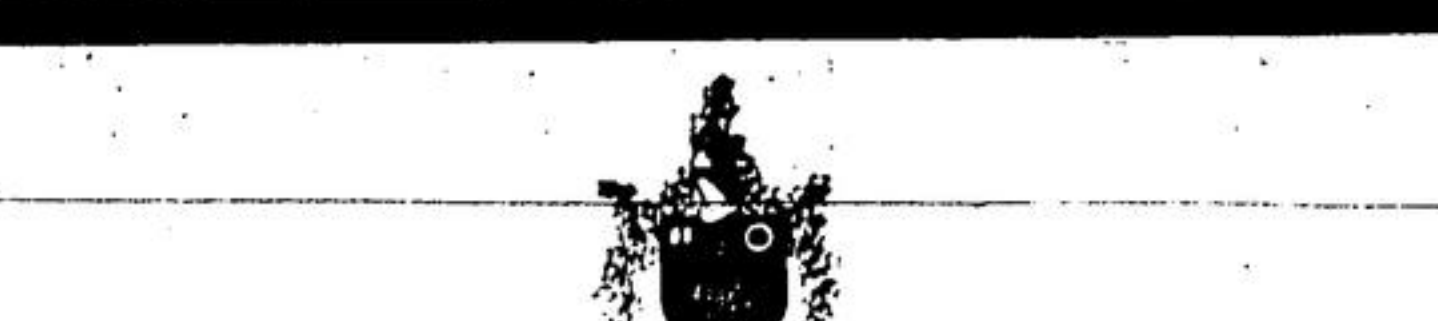
