CONTRACTS PLACED EXCEED \$225,000,000

WAR orders placed by the Government with Canadian firms now total \$4,000,000,000, with an aggregate value of more than \$225,000,000. Orders were placed with 4,400 firms.

INCREASE LIMIT SAVINGS CERTIFICATES

Beginning with the calendar year of 1941 any person may hold War Savings Certificates dated in any one calendar year up to a total maturity of \$600. Formerly the limit had been set at \$500 for any one year.
