EDITORIAL NO. 3

The Press And The Government

Misconceptions relating to the right of the press to criticize, commend or suggest to government bodies, civic, provincial or federal, is often assailed...

Many well-meaning people conscientiously believe the press should express no conviction upon civic, provincial or federal affairs. They assume that to offer criticism is to become partisan...

Members of civic bodies sometimes point out that newspapers have such a tremendous influence in the community, and that their circulation is so widespread...

Another assumption of some men and women in public office is that any criticism offered in a newspaper is personal, rather than objective. That is not true...

The newspaper which comments on public affairs far from being presumptuous, is but fulfilling one of

the most important and vital functions of the press. If it is genuine in its desire to be of service to the community, it will open its columns to signed letters...

Building?—Then Hurry

The Financial Post last week carried a feature article regarding housing conditions in Canada. It carried so much of interest to home owners and to prospective owners that we quote a few of its paragraphs:

"If you own your own home, 1940 brought more chances to sell than 1935 and 1941 will probably bring better offers. If you have been coasting along with an overdue mortgage, don't bank too much on being able to slide through 1941 on credit."

More important to private individuals is the fact that residential construction in the three-month period is up 25 per cent. over 1940.

Labor costs in 1940 do not show much of an advance, only some 3 per cent. above 1939. Building materials were only some 13 per cent higher at the beginning of 1941 than they were two years earlier.

If the figures indicate that it is just about last call for low-cost building, they tell a more pleasant tale for the man who already owns his home. Improved demand for housing is shown by the 25 per cent. increase in residential building.
