PAUL PREACHES FAITH IN CHRIST

Golden Text: As it is written, but fled by Faith, 21:28. Rom. 1:17.

Exposition. I. How We are Justified by Faith.

Fishermen Reap Large Sum From Whitefish Haul

Lake Winnipeg Operators Expect 2,850,000-Pound Catch; Higher Prices in Canada and United States

WINNIPEG, (CP) One hundred and thirty-six licensed fishermen will share a \$200,000 melon this summer while thousands of citizens in the United States and Canada enjoy fresh whitefish, now being caught in Lake Winnipeg, Western Canada's largest inland body of water.

Four-man crews in 32-foot passable boats are making the permitted 2,850,000-pound catch. The season opened early in June and closes Aug. 2. Each licensed operator is permitted by the Manitoba Government Fisheries Branch to take 21,000 pounds for which he receives seven cents a pound, with prospects of a slightly better price due to the great demand from the United States.

The fish are delivered to stations located at strategic points on the lake shore and temporary employment is given to hundreds of men who make up the station crews. Usually from seven to 11 boats operate from one station.

Greatest activity is at George's Island, 225 miles north of Winnipeg, where some 200 men go annually to get the choice quality fish. At this point one operator has started refining of fish oil.

The lake has steadily increased since 1939 when the provincial government took control of the industry and limited the catch. In 1940 the quota of 2,600,000 pounds was split between 118 licensed operators who received from 54 to 55 cents a pound, almost doubling the 1939 catch of 1,700,000 pounds made by 69 operators.

Reached Quota Quickly While some of the 136 crews reached their quota early in June this year, department heads said this was not a certain indication that the population of the lake's whitefish was increasing. A survey later, however, may show some change, a spokesman said.

A fisherman's quota this year will ensure him gross receipts of at least \$1,170 from which he must pay costs of operating his boat and those crew members but department spokesmen said each licensee would get a "handsome profit on the season's operations."

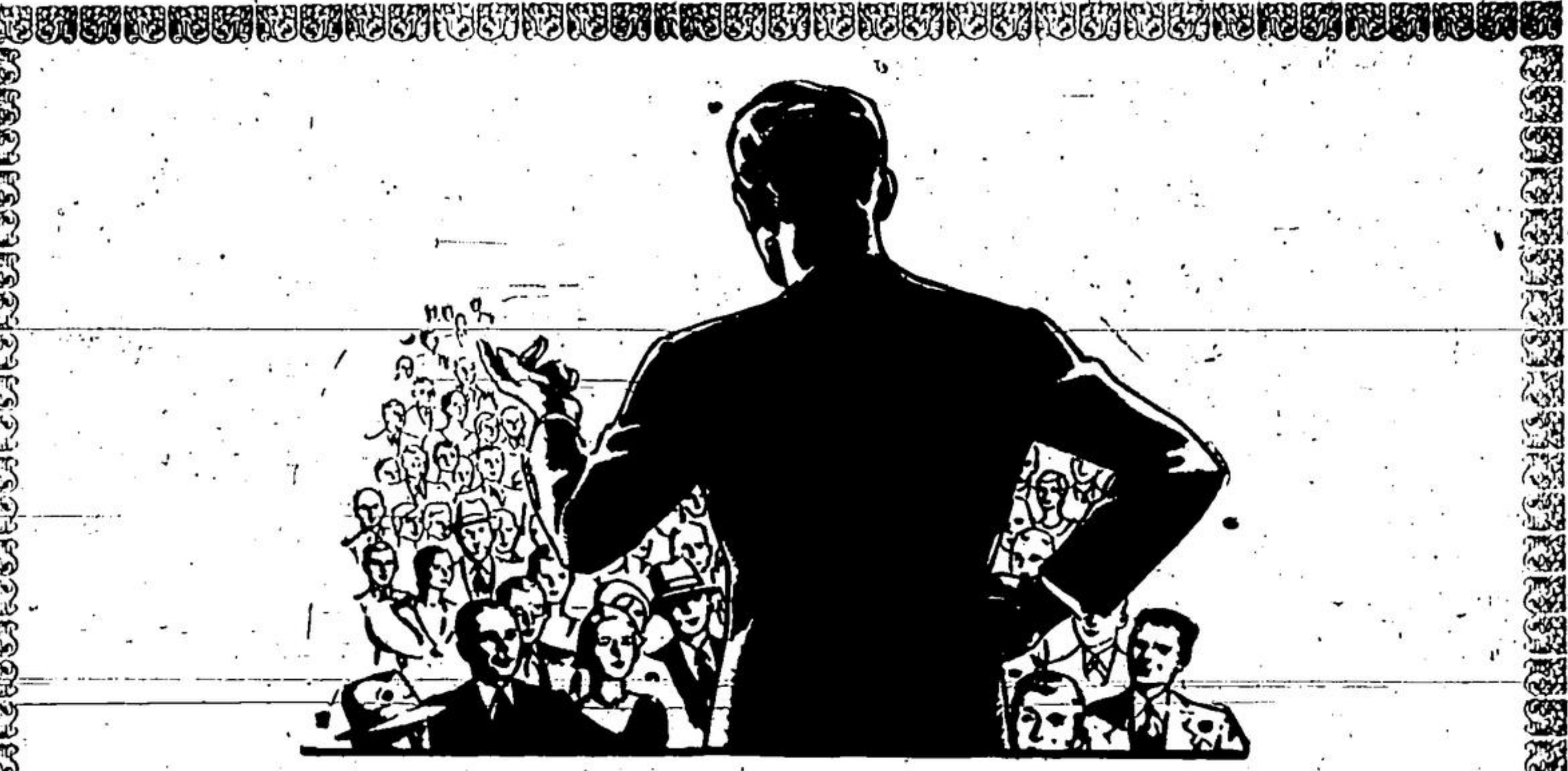
The fisherman, who makes his sale at the lake fish station, also can catch sturgeon, claimed by many to be the most delicious fish food on the market. Sturgeon fishing alone, however, is not particularly remunerative in Lake Winnipeg but one fisherman recently caught a 110-pounder that netted him \$71 at Berens River.

At mid-lake point on the eastern shore sturgeon is selling wholesale for 60 cents a pound and caviar from Lake Winnipeg from the fish at \$3 a pound in July. The sturgeon quota for Lake Winnipeg is 10,000 pounds while up to 60,000 pounds can be caught in several other northern lakes and streams.

The fisherman's day starts at 2:30 a.m. and until sunset he toils lifting his nets and re-setting them, packing his catch in ice aboard his own boat and later in 100-pound boxes for movement to market.

When the boxes are placed in the lake station's warehouse his operations are complete. Later a bigger lake boat moves the boxes to Selkirk, on the Red River, 20 miles north of Winnipeg, or to the Alexander Avenue docks at Winnipeg.

From there whitefish can be processed or trucked to American centers for late tables within 50 hours after being caught in lake nets.
